About the Cover: A figure walking on the waters during a difficult night at sea is a terrifying sight for the disciples. But Jesus reveals Himself, telling the disciples not to be afraid. Jesus gives them insight into His divine nature. He treads upon the waves, commands all of creation, and intends to pass by (see Job 9:1–12). This Jesus, who gets in the boat, is God in the flesh. This Jesus is also our Savior, who has complete control of our eternal lives, won on the cross.
