About the Cover: Though the food for this bodily life is from the Lord Himself, its purpose is temporary. "Man does not live by bread alone, but man lives by every word that comes from the mouth of the LORD" (Deuteronomy 8:3). Jesus instructs us to focus not on temporary food but on the eternal food found in His teaching. Jesus feeds us with the eternal food from heaven in the Lord's Supper, where He delivers to us the benefits of His cross and resurrection in His body and blood.
