WITNESSES TO CHRIST

As we begin our Lenten journey, we focus our attention upon various witnesses to Christ in John's Gospel. We begin with John the Baptist, a man on a mission. "There came a man who was sent from God; his name was John. He came as to witness concerning that light, so that through him all people might believe" (John 1:6–7). John the Baptist's mission is "to witness concerning that light." In fact, fourteen times in John's Gospel, the word *witness* is connected with John the Baptist. "He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light. The true light that gives light to every person was coming into the world" (John 1:8–9). John points us to Jesus, who takes away our sin, our guilt, and our shame at the cross.

Confession and Absolution

P Brothers and sisters, the ashes we are about to receive remind us of the frailty of our condition. If the Son of God had not died for us sinful men, our condition would be sorry indeed. In contriteness and humility we put ashes on in the form of the cross, the symbol of our salvation. We realize that on our own we can do nothing; it is through Christ's Passion, death, and resurrection that we can do all things. In examining our inmost being, we find nothing in us but sin. God has promised through the Office of the Keys entrusted to the Church to hear and forgive all those who truly repent. Realizing our condition and in the spirit of contriteness and humility, let us make confession before His heavenly throne:

C Most merciful God, we confess that we are by nature sinful and unclean. We have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved You with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We justly deserve Your present and eternal punishment. For the sake of Your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in Your will and walk in Your ways to the glory of Your holy name. Amen.

P In the mercy of Almighty God, Jesus Christ was given to die for us, and for His sake God forgives us all our sins. To those who believe in Jesus Christ He gives the power to become the children of God and bestows on them the Holy Spirit. Imposition of Ashes

As the congregation comes forward in silence to receive ashes, the pastor speaks the words of God spoken to our first parents in Eden after the fall, “Dust you are and to dust you will return.” (Genesis 3: 19) Ashes are a sign of mortality and death. They remind us of our sin and our desperate need for forgiveness. In Biblical times, people would show their repentance of sin by putting on sackcloth and ashes (Matt. 11: 21). The ashes we put on are in the form of the cross, the very symbol of our salvation from sin.

Old Testament Reading

Joel 2:12–19

¹²“Yet even now,” declares the LORD, “return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; ¹³and rend your hearts and not your garments.” Return to the LORD, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster. ¹⁴Who knows whether he will not turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind him, a grain offering and a drink offering for the LORD your God? ¹⁵Blow the trumpet in Zion; consecrate a fast; call a solemn assembly; ¹⁶gather the people. Consecrate the congregation; assemble the elders; gather the children, even nursing infants. Let the bridegroom leave his room, and the bride her chamber. ¹⁷Between the vestibule and the altar let the priests, the ministers of the LORD, weep and say, “Spare your people, O LORD, and make not your heritage a reproach, a byword among the nations. Why should they say among the peoples, ‘Where is their God?’”

¹⁸Then the LORD became jealous for his land and had pity on his people. ¹⁹The LORD answered and said to his people, “Behold, I am sending to you grain, wine, and oil, and you will be satisfied; and I will no more make you a reproach among the nations.”

Epistle

2 Corinthians 5:20b—6:10

We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. ²¹For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

¹Working together with him, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. ²For he says,

“In a favorable time I listened to you,
and in a day of salvation I have helped you.”

Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. ³We put no obstacle in anyone’s way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, ⁴but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: by great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, ⁵beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; ⁶by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love; ⁷by truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; ⁸through honor and dishonor, through slander and praise. 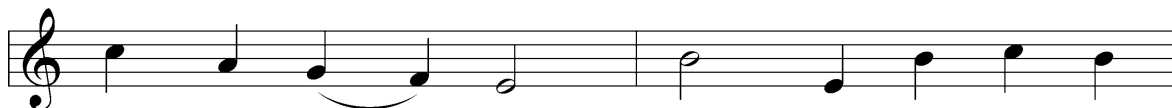

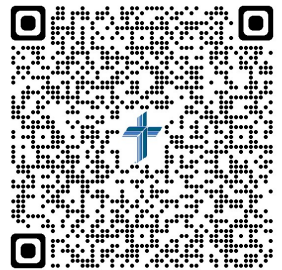
