The deliberation process involves weighing a number of factors and trying to determine where you are best suited for service; where the Lord wants you to be and how and where you can best serve Him and His church. While I was

deliberating, several of you reached out to me and shared that you felt I had more work to do here and that at any rate, I wouldn't be staying too long. Thank you for that encouragement and I think the whole experience will refresh and renew my desire to serve at Lord of Life.


