I had the privilege to speak with Pastor McMillian the other day. As many of you know, he recently recovered from Covid 19, something he picked up during a cruise through the Panama Canal. Fortunately, God answered the many prayers on his behalf and Pastor McMillian has fully recovered.

Over the years I have spoken with Pastor Ric about the founding of Lord of Life. What a different time that was and what a different place Plano was! For those of you who don't know, in the early days, Lord of Life did not operate in Plano at all. After some demographic studies and based on the location of other Lutheran Churches in the area, they had it in mind start something in the area around Frankfort and Preston Road in Dallas.

Initially, they rented space at an old police station located at 6808 Frankford Road (Frankford and Hillcrest where the Levine Academy, a Jewish School is located today.) They started sharing the space with police, but eventually the congregation rented out the whole building. It was at this facility that the congregation was chartered on May 20th 1990. In 1991 The Texas District acquired property nearby on Davenport and Frankfurt and offered it to Lord of Life. Unfortunately, the property sloped down to a swampy area and needed a lot of work to make it useable. While deciding how to proceed with that property, the current property on 15th Street came available. The current buildings did not exist, but there was a church on the property. It was a small mission congregation that never quite took off. Nevertheless, the sellers were eager to see the fact, they stipulated this and also dropped the

land purchased by another Christian church, in price down to a bargain so a church could afford the 5 acres we now have.

According to the service folder for that day, the list of charter members (see picture) includes at least three current members and many other people, some of you will recognize. While the history of the building and different locations is interesting, the real story of Lord of Life or any congregation is the story of God working among His people to create and strengthen faith in order to bring them to Himself. That story of Lord of Life continues to this day and for it, we are truly grateful. Because of the current pandemic, we may not get to celebrate these blessings as we had hoped, but we will still acknowledge the Lord's goodness in providing for us a place to thank and praise Him and a place where He is at work and also fellow people whom He has called and who are our brothers and sisters and fellow workers in His Kingdom.
