State of the Parish

Friends in Christ.

We are in the Easter season, and besides the very Good News that Jesus is risen from the dead and has defeated death for us, we also have good news to report about our congregation. What follows is a series of subjects going on at Lord of Life over the past several months. These were also shared recently at the May Voters' meeting in my State of the Parish report.

Lent, Holy Week and Easter went well. I really liked the Lenten theme and the series (Witnesses to Christ by Rev. Dr. Reed Lessing) which provided a good framework to build on. The services -Midweek and Sundays- were well attended. In fact, our service attendance has been up by a significant amount since last year, certainly due to COVID, but it is also due to another fact that I am happy to report and that is an increase in visitors and new members.

We have added several new members and we have more good prospects that, Lord willing, will also soon become members. This is simply a blessing from God. We have not done some new program or project to attract people, but our recent growth has been a combination of people moving into the area, simple life changes wherein people have decided to get back to church, or the most time-tested method of all: the invitation of a friend to join them at church.

Financially, we are also in good shape and it is only getting better. You may recall how recently, we had people speak to the congregation after the services in an attempt to educate the congregation about the remaining debt on the building. We thought that by merely sharing with people the numbers and reminding them how paying off our debt sooner will save the church money, some folks might respond by helping to reduce our debt. Boy was that proven to be right! The response to this education has been wonderful. The number of people who contribute to the building fund has increased significantly and in a matter of months, these extra gifts along with our regular payments, have reduced our debt by more than \$25,000 (from \$148,208 to \$121,778). Thank you so much to all who have and will continue to help with this. Finishing off our debt will help to ensure we are on a strong financial footing for years to come and free us up to use our resources toward ministry.

Another positive phenomenon happening at Lord of Life is that new leaders are stepping up to serve. Charles Hacker, a longtime member of Lord of Life, was elected to serve as our new president, and we also have other much newer members who have agreed to serve on boards and the council. We have a healthy mix of ages and experience which is a very good situation. This is especially so, in light of the fact that this last year we said goodbye to some real pillars of our congregation, folks who contributed a great deal of time and effort over the years. I am thinking especially of Al Manning and Shirley Sparks. As one faithful generation passes away, it is reassuring to see another continue the work of the Kingdom.

Along those same lines, we had two significant retirements recently. Our Music Director, Vicki Frinsko, retired at the end of February and then Lynda Abbott, the head of our Altar Guild, decided Easter Sunday would be her last day. Both Vicki and Lynda are irreplaceable. Yet, we are working to find ways to fill in the gaps left by the retirement of both.

The search is ongoing for a Director of Music. I had spoken with people and received some recommendations, but nothing has panned out so far. We have several options we are considering and fortunately, we have been blessed with a deep bench, that is, we have a lot of people who can cover the organ duties on Sunday mornings. Because of this, we do not have to rush and take the first person who comes along, but we can take our time and find the right person who will be a good fit at Lord of Life.

Likewise, with the altar guild, we have several ladies who are willing to step up and cover the work that needs to be done. Lynda contributed an enormous amount of time and effort for more than 10 years. It is unlikely one single person will be willing to contribute that same amount of time, however, by the combined work of several people, I am confident all the work will be done. The guild will be meeting in a month or two to reassess how the work is going and what needs to change as we move forward. Until then, any questions or concerns about anything pertaining to the altar and paraments, etc. should be directed to me. Along those lines, since so much is changing already, if you have any suggestions for change in the future regarding these matters, please let me know. One such suggestion I have received already has been to change the wine we use for Holy Communion. Do you have any thoughts on this? Again, just let me know.

Overall, I am happy to announce that God has truly blessed Lord of Life with growth and that all is going well. Lord willing, this time of prosperity will allow us all to serve faithfully and continue to proclaim the hope we have in Christ, the hope that binds us together and will unite us for eternity.


