Here is a recent quote from the archbishop of Cologne, Rainer Maria Cardinal Woelki, translated and published in the journal *First Things*. While speaking about Roman Catholics specifically, I find his words a good reminder for all Christians.

He was commenting on the wide spread misunderstandings that people outside the Church have of Catholics and the Christian faith in general, and says it's time to "Wake up!"

"It [the pervasive lack of basic knowledge of the Christian faith] makes clear that we are doing something wrong. We are talking too much about the Church in terms defined by the world, and not enough about Christ. Too often, we look at ourselves, and not often enough do we look to Him. From the beginning, Christianity was an alternative culture; it stood in the middle of this world, and entered a particular moment of history. It was neither a school of thought nor a philosophy, but from the start an encounter with a living person, a faith in flesh and blood, one that can be concretely experienced. This faith never made common cause with the world. Our faith has always pointed to a different, transcendent world.'

Israel anyone?


