To be seen, or not to be seen?

“Beware of practicing your righteousness before other people in order to be seen by them, for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven.” Matt 6:1

In Matthew 6:1-18, Jesus warns against those who pray and fast and give alms in a way that only draws attention to themselves. It seems their prayers and fasting are not really directed to God, as much as they are toward others, and by extension, themselves. Likewise, the charitable giver has in mind how he looks and how impressive he must be to God, but he doesn't think as much of the one he helps. The point is clear: God sees through all of our hypocrisy and nothing is hidden from Him, and motives matter.

It is interesting then, that a resource from our synod's stewardship board has little pieces of paper available for those who give online to place in the collection plate during the offering. [See image] What are we to make of this? Is this violating the command of Christ who warned against outward displays? Is this worrying too much about what others see and think of you? I suppose it could be, but then again if prayer and fasting could be done in a sinful way, then just about anything can be turned into a sin. And besides, in Matthew 6, Jesus didn't tell His disciples the solution to the problem of "praying in order to be seen by men" was to cease praying in front of people altogether, instead He taught them how to do it faithfully and gave them the Lord's Prayer. Likewise, we don't stop praying in church on Sunday so no one will get the idea we are showing off! No, we pray and try to model good prayers that direct our thoughts toward the glory of God and the need of others.

But what about offerings?

I think we can all agree it is inappropriate for someone to brag about how much they give or to give in a way to be seen; but is it okay for people to know that we give at all? Along this line, let me share with you an anecdote.

A very faithful contributor to her church once told me that her child asked why she and daddy didn't give any offerings. She was shocked by the question since she and her husband took seriously the practice of tithing and encouraged their children to do the same. Why would her child think they didn't give to the church? ... Because they gave online and the child never saw them put anything in the offering plate.

I suppose then, that with offerings, just as with prayer, not only do we need to avoid the wrong ways of doing it, but it is important for us to see good examples so we can learn how to do it faithfully. I suppose we could just cease collecting offerings during the worship service altogether. We could ask every member to send their offerings in the mail or give online. But since the time of the Apostles, God's people have collected gifts in worship, so it seems unlikely the practice is going to end, even as people increasingly go cashless and rarely write a check. The notion of doing away with the offering seems like the wrong solution to the problem; an overreaction to a potential misdeed. Collecting offerings in the church service doesn't need to be abolished and, in fact, it still serves a useful purpose beyond collecting funds; it sets a good example of what faithful people do. As long as we collect offerings in our worship services, one might just be giving the impression that he or she does not support the church every time the plate passes us by without a contribution. If so, this could be a stumbling block to others. —An unintentional stumbling block, no less, given by those who in reality set the example by tithing online!

So, it seems the paper notes for the offering plates are provided to dispel the notion that those who give online do not give at all. And maybe that's an important thing to clear up. Using these slips of paper that say, "I give online" may be something you want to consider. Ultimately what you give and how you give is something between you and God. Our neighbors should not critique what they see and do not understand. Nevertheless, is it too much to think our neighbors may be encouraged by your example of regularly and faithfully contributing offerings to the church? Haven't all of us seen the good example of others and learned from them? If you give online and would like to participate in the offering during the service, the slips will be available for your use. You may choose to use them if you like, or not. As in so many things, you are free in Christ. —PrS

LIFE CHAIN A SUCCESS

On Sunday Oct. 6, from 2-3 p.m. members of Lord of Life formed a Life Chain along 15th Street on church property. We joined a national effort on that day with thousands of Christians everywhere, from all walks of life, to provide a pro-life public witness, to pray to end abortion, and to tell others that Jesus loves them and forgives them. The Life Team at Lord of Life was joined for this event by the Scarth and Shaltanis families and Pat Greer. Thank you to all who participated.


A Life Chain is actually a prayer service where we stood in prayerful spirit, being humble yet bold in our obedience to God, recognizing our stand is for the children, their mothers and other relatives, and for our Nation's preservation. In the spirit of Christian love we committed to be peaceful, prayerful and polite in both word and deed and to acknowledge motorists who responded to our signs in a kindly and sincere manner.

On the back of our Life Chain signs were songs and prayer topics for our meditation. Songs included: How Great Thou Art, Create in Me a Clean Heart, Jesus Loves the Little Children, He is Lord, and a patriotic song, AMERICA. Several topics for continual prayer were offered on the back of the signs as well. They included: prayers for personal repentance, prayers that motorists will be receptive to our witness, prayers for God's grace on healing for mothers who have had abortions, for the crisis pregnancy centers, prayers for Godly wisdom in our government and courts, prayers for the love and unity of God's people such that His Will prevails in our families and lives. We also recited selected Psalms and the Lord's Prayer.

The traffic was busy from both directions on 15th St. on the afternoon of Oct. 6 from 2-3 p.m. An estimated 1200 cars passed by our Life Chain during that hour, with many positive responses. If two people were in each car, that's a witness to 2500 individuals!

Lutherans for Life designate January each year as LIFE month. The Life Team at LOL will highlight LIFE affirming activities during January 2020 at our church and elsewhere. Stay tuned.
