Happenings at Lord of Life


Dear Friends in Christ,

The idea was presented to me by a home schooling family that this might appeal to some of the people who already attend classes at our church during the week. This additional opportunity would be an hour or two during the week and provide a program for the adults and children. If you would like to attend the meeting, my letter to the families is included below. Please pass it on to anyone you know who might be interested. If you might be interested in volunteering with this group in the future that would be greatly appreciated. Just let me know.

Finally, the news is out about Vicki Frinsko's impending retirement early next year. Of course, we are all going to miss her excellent service as Music Director. Vicki is a joy to work with and a true servant of the Lord and His Church. Many are wondering about the plan for the future of music leadership at Lord of Life. The administrative council and board of elders have discussed it at length and considered different options. The Word of God provides Inoculation from the Hostility of the World



It's clear that we live in a society that is largely hostile to God, to the Gospel and to Christians such as us.

St. Paul. St. Peter and St. John speak about the nature and source of that hostility:

For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Ephesians 6:12

Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. 1 Peter 5:8

Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, for many false prophets have gone out into the world. 1 John 4:1

But, thanks be to God, He has given us faith

through the working of the Holy Spirit; He has done all that is necessary for our salvation; and He provides His Word as a means to face this hostility.

St. Paul and St. James tell us how we may be built up and matured in our faith to resist the hostility of the world:

And he gave the apostles, the the evangelists. the prophets. shepherds and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God. to mature manhood, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ, so that we may no longer be children, tossed to and fro by the waves and carried about by every wind of doctrine, by human cunning, by craftiness in deceitful schemes. Ephesians 4:11-14

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. Colossians 3:16

All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.

2 Timothy 3:16-17

Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. James 4:7-8a

This is summed up for us in the Collect for the Word:

Blessed Lord, You have caused all Holy Scriptures to be written for our learning. Grant that we may so hear them, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest them that, by patience and comfort of Your holy Word, we may embrace and ever hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

Therefore, my brothers and sisters in Christ, let us remain in His Word for the strengthening of our faith and encouragement of our spirits. This is our inoculation against the hostile world in which we live.

We do this whenever we read and study the scriptures, and also when we attend weekly worship where the Word is read and preached and taught.




